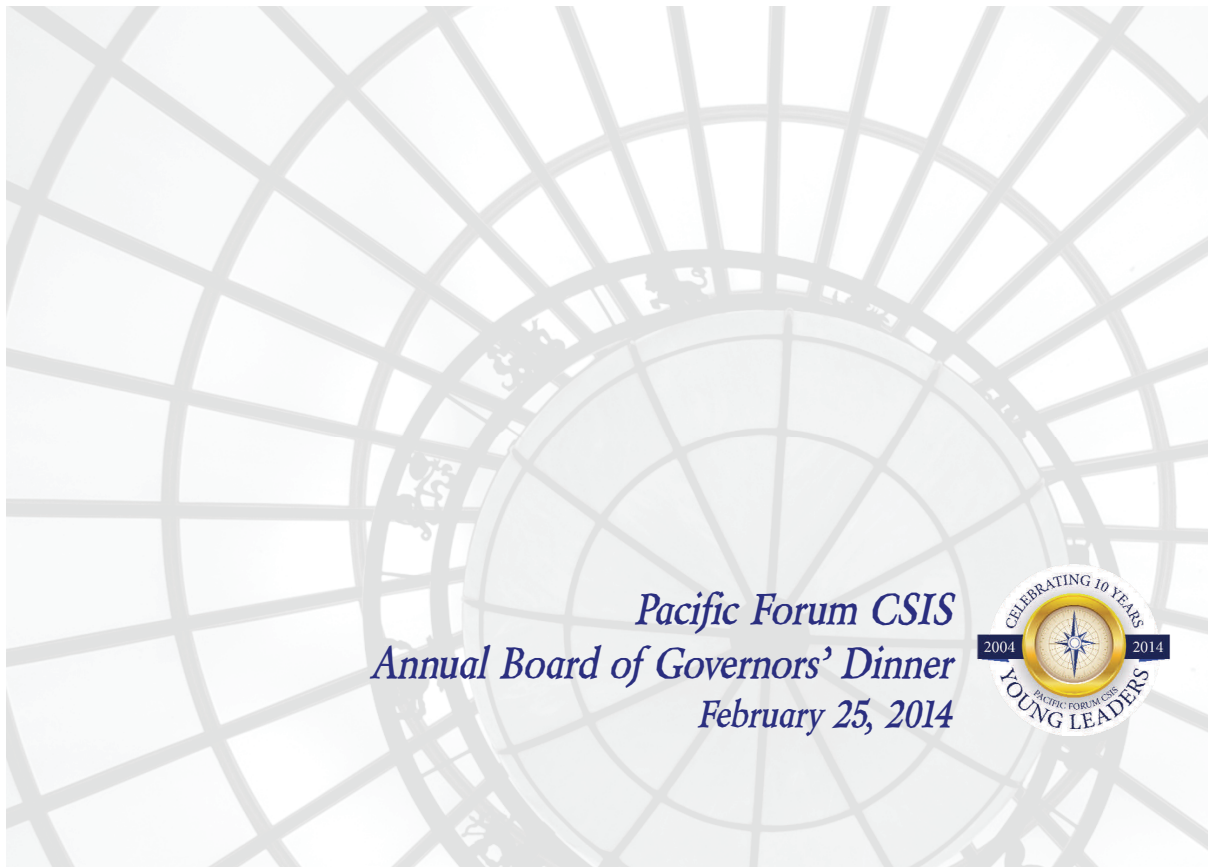




**Directions to Pacific Beach Hotel

**Keynote Speaker: Irene Hirano Inouye**

Ms. Irene Hirano Inouye is President of the U.S.-Japan Council. Through her work at the Council, she also administers the TOMODACHI Initiative, a public-private partnership with the U.S. Embassy in Tokyo that invests in young Japanese and Americans while supporting the recovery of the Tohoku region. She is the former President and founding CEO of the Japanese American National Museum in Los Angeles, a position she held for twenty years. A recipient of bachelor's and master's degrees in Public Administration from the University of Southern California, Ms. Hirano Inouye has extensive experience in non-profit administration, community education and public affairs with culturally diverse communities nationwide. Ms. Hirano Inouye's professional and community activities include serving as Chair and Trustee, Ford Foundation; Trustee and immediate past Chair, Kresge Foundation; Trustee, Washington Center; and Trustee, Independent Sector. She was married to the late U.S. Senator Daniel K. Inouye of Hawaii.

Ms. Hirano Inouye will make the keynote address at the 2014 Pacific Forum CSIS Board of Governors' Dinner. She will provide her insights on current dynamics within the Asia Pacific region and the role of non-governmental and non-profit organizations in building peace and stability in the region.
