UN Security Council Resolution 1540 (2004) mandates that all member states maintain appropriate effective national export controls to prevent WMD proliferation. Yet many countries are concerned about the economic consequences of adopting and implementing strategic trade controls (STC). This study therefore assesses the effects of STC implementation globally and within ASEAN member states. After sharing the findings that STC implementation is associated with very *positive* economic outcomes, this session discusses contemporary export control applications and what they mean for the nonproliferation regime in Asia. *Speakers*: Crystal Pryor Mark Manantan
